About TABPHE

History

On April 7-9, 1973, several representatives of state and private institutions of higher education, within and outside the State of Texas, met at the Ramada Inn Central in Dallas, Texas, to discuss concerns pertinent to the well-being of African Americans at higher education institutions in the state of Texas. It was determined that because all in attendance served in various specialized positions within these institutions with a commitment to equal opportunity and affirmative action efforts in higher education, that we formally organize an association to promote, maintain and ensure the development and growth of African Americans in the educational process.

Under the leadership of those who served as president of the state organization, for the more than 40 years following this action, hundreds of African-American leaders have acted as a unified force to address new and recurring challenges in Texas higher education.

Mission

The Texas Association of Black Personnel in Higher Education (TABPHE) is a statewide, voluntary, educational association that represents all levels of higher education and serves as a voice for Black faculty, staff, students and administrators in order to ensure a better educational system for all. TABPHE provides an avenue for professional development opportunities that enrich higher education personnel and improve the quality of their professional growth.

Vision

TABPHE's vision is to ensure that the higher educational system in the state of Texas provides equitable opportunities and advancement for Black personnel while fostering a positive environment for Black students to successfully matriculate.

Philosophy

TABPHE believes that human performance, increased productivity, and quality of life are enhanced through the sharing of individual experiences. Higher education personnel are rich in experience, knowledge and skills that play a vital role in helping educational institutions address key goals for achieving success.

About TABPHE Fellows

TABPHE Fellows is an initiative to help generate new memberships, regenerate old memberships, and build new leaders for the Texas Association of Black Personnel in Higher Education. Interested participants may apply, and/or be nominated, for the honor of becoming a TABPHE Fellows.



The Process

Applications and nomination forms will be reviewed by the FELLOWS Selection Committee. All applicants will be notified of their denial or acceptance, via email, by mid-October. A leadership project will be given to the group of TABPHE Fellows. It will be up to the TABPHE Fellows to create, development, and implement the leadership project under the guidance of the FELLOWS Selection Committee, with feedback from the TABPHE State Board. Upon completion of the project, TABPHE Fellows will be invited to present their project before TABPHE's Board of Directors as well as present their leadership project at the following conference during a special session.

TABPHE Fellows will receive complimentary registration to the following conference. They will also be encouraged to help plan, market and promote the FELLOWS Leadership Initiative. Upon completion, the FELLOWS will be recognized at the following conference for their outstanding achievement.
